External Resources for Testing and Understanding Accessibility Issues

- Test the color contrast on a web page to ensure that text is readable for the widest range of users: [Color Contrast Checker](#) [1]
- Test the semantic markup to ensure that the meaning of the page will render well in a screen reader: [Web Accessibility Evaluation WAVE](#) [2]
- There are browser specific tools that can aid accessibility reviews, such as the [Chrome Plug Ins for Accessibility](#) [3] and [Firefox Accessibility Toolbar](#) [4]. These are more useful for web developers than editors.
- Check how your page will sound on a screen reader. Try [NVAccess](#) [5], a free screen reader.
