Accessibility Testing Resources

External Resources for Testing and Understanding Accessibility Issues

- Test the color contrast on a web page to ensure that text is readable for the widest range of users: <u>Color</u> <u>Contrast Checker</u> [1]
- Test the semantic markup to ensure that the meaning of the page will render well in a screen reader: <u>Web</u> <u>Accessibility Evaluation WAVE</u> [2]
- There are browser specific tools that can aid accessibility reviews, such as the <u>Chrome Plug Ins for</u> <u>Accessibility</u> [3]and <u>Firefox Accessibility Toolbar</u> [4]. These are more useful for web developers than editors.
- Check how your page will sound on a screen reader. Try <u>NVAccess</u> [5], a free screen reader.
