THE GOIZUETA FOUNDATION TO SUPPORT THE CREATION OF A DIGITAL HUMANITIES LABORATORY AT THE YALE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Yale University Library recently announced a \$3 million gift from The Goissacta Foundation to inaugurate a comprehensive initiative in science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (\$78aat) education at Yale. The gift will be used to establish a Digital Humanities Laboratory in Sterling Memorial Library (\$30L), which will provide expertise, equipment, and facilities for faculty and students across a wide range of subjects. A portion of the award will also establish as endowed fund to suppose \$71AM education at Yale.

STEAM embodies the idea of amplifying the strengths of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) by combining them with creativity, visual acuity, and aesthetics drawn from the arm. Yale University Librarian Susan Gibborus remarked, "The establishment of the Digital Hutranities Laboratory provides a locus for the burgeoning intendisciplinary initiatives across Yale which explore teaching, learning, and research at the intersections of STEAM. We are very grateful to The Geimetra Foundation for providing Yale with the opportunity to develop robust support and services for faculty and students."

The laboratory will catalyze existing projects at Yale and support the exploration of new ideas that connect established disciplines and audiences with Yale's world-class cultural heritage collections. The term "digital humanities" encompasses a variety of emerging practices including the computational analysis of cultural data and the democratization of caching and research through global networks. Technologists, scientists, and humanities scholars will be able to use the laboratory to create new and compelling ways to engage with the sciences, arts, and digital technology.

"We believe that STRAM is a critical component of twenty-first-century learning, and The Goirneta Foundation is pleased to join with Yale University in this strategic initiative. It will provide a unique opportunity to join the university's historic strengths in teaching and learning in the humanitics with my father's vision for innovation and creativity in education and public life," commented Olga Goizneta Rawls, Chair and Chief Executive Officer of The Goimeta Foundation. The Goimeta Foundation was established in 1992 by the late Roberto Goizueta, former Chief Executive Officer of the Coca-Cola Company. The mission of the Adanta-based foundation is to empower individuals by partnering with innovative non-profit organizations to produce lasting change in the areas of education and family services

Mr. Goizneta graduated from Yale College in 1053 with a degree in engineering, and The Goizneta Foundation has been a generous denor to Yale, especially in the areas of biomedical and chemical engineering. Most recently, the foundation has supported the Advanced Leadership Program in the School of Engineering and Applied Science, and the Science, Technology, and Research Scholars (STARS) Program in Yale College, designed to support bisnoically underrepresented students in the sciences, engineering, and mathematics.
