Guide for students submitting proposals for Student Research at YUL Exhibit:

Members of the selection committee come from a range of subject areas and have experience producing exhibits. Based on our collective knowledge and experience, we will be considering proposals based on the following criteria during the selection process:

- Completed research lends itself to visual display
- Project includes research using YUL collections

Each proposal must include a one-page statement from the student that describes their research, demonstrates clear understanding of responsibilities and timeframe of the exhibit project in addition to other academic commitments. (Please submit a PDF document with nomination.)

Select a librarian or faculty member who will work with you to review your item selection and final exhibit text. If you don't already have a faculty member or librarian you are currently working with the exhibits committee can help you connect with one.

Examples of what is included in a strong proposal:

- 1. Evidence of in-depth exploration of a significant collection or use of multiple collections in the Yale University Library.
- 2. Evidence of experience working with library collections.
- 3. Evidence of strong familiarity with the subject discipline.
- 4. Evidence of student time already spent with the collection and clear indication that applicant has the ability to develop the project more fully.
- 5. Research must translate well to a physical exhibit with strong visual elements that further the thesis or narrative of the research.
