Ellsworth J. chairman of the Audio-Visual Certer; Alvin B. Kernan, associate pro vost; Lawder, who is an assistant professsor of history of art; Georges May, dean of Yale College; Edward L. Stone, director of financial planning in the Office of Development, and David Walker, editor of "Yale Reports.'

The university began including film in its curriculum five years ago and has plans to expand in this
